Re: Proposed Extraction / Landfill Walkford Farm

Dear Minister,


I would like to bring to your attention the above, on the grounds mentioned in my enclosed letter Dated 11th July 2006 and copies of the petition, sent to Hampshire County Council Minerals and Waste.

This proposed project is seriously flawed on the following counts:

- (1) That Gavel Extraction resulting in a Refuge Tip / Land Fill next to an established and ongoing Burial Ground as a direct result. This is both. '**Immoral and Unethical**'.
- (2) The fact that 'Walkford Brook' lies between two large areas of this proposed project. Water from this fast flowing brook travels through Chewton Glen, then Chewton Bunny and finally into the sea at Higcliffe Beach. This could possibly result in **deadly Toxins poisoning a large area**, especially the sea and beaches below at Highcliffe.
- (3) An '**Electrified Railway Line**' runs across the southern parameters of this proposed site in a deep gully. Thus any escaping '**Methane Gases**' could accumulate especially in cold weather and result in an **explosion and derailment and possibly death**.

I and the local residents of Walkford, would also be very obliged, if you could arrange for one or more of your agents to come and take a good look at the areas mentioned and their surroundings.
